


BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT AND CAPITAL PROJECT

BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

- grocery
- We created a **comprehensive business plan** that integrates the **grocery programming** and **social programming** aspects of the Co-op. This ensures that we have a viable business model that can meet our mission, vision and core values.
- We updated our Market Study to be more reflective of the Midtown community of Kingston

CAPITAL PROJECT

- Hired MASS Design Group and embarked on expanding the 708 Broadway building into a functional store space
- **Completed pre-design phase** (with major help from our Members during our "design your coop event) in November 2022
- **Hired Owners' Representative,** Susan, to guide us through the building process
- Worked with grocery planners to create a highly
 efficient grocery floor plan



GOVERNANCE, STORE LEADERSHIP, AND FINANCE

GOVERNANCE

- Completed bylaws revision to bolster worker member rights that will be voted on by membership (you!)
- Instituted weekly and monthly committee reports
- Organized Policy Governance education for the council
- Hired a lawyer to be on retainer for the co-op
- Developed clear staffing plans for co-op development
- Appointed **3 new council members**
- Council and staff members attended Up and Coming 2022 Cooperative Development Conference


FINANCE
